


Fig. 1. Bathymetric map of the Tsuken Hill. Contours are in  $100\ \mathrm{m}$ .




Fig. 2. Bathymetric map of the Tsuken Hill, shown with track lines. Contours are in 100 m.




Fig. 3. Bathymetric profile across the Tsuken Hill.
