




Fig. 1. Bathymetric map of the Shiki Seamount. Contours are in 100 m.




Fig. 2. Bathymetric map of the Shiki Seamount, shown with track lines. Contours are in $100\ m.$




Fig. 3. Bathymetric profile across the Shiki Seamount.
