### My career path and projects / Achievements

- 2008 started working in Maritime Administration of Latvia as a cartographer.
- Bachelor's degree in Geography. Cartography was small part of studies so practical and theoretical knowledge was limited.
- First duties updating of List of Lights, Sailing directions, compilation of paper charts.
- 2011 after finishing training course in Nautical Cartography followed promotion to Senior Cartographer's position.
- Continued working on paper charts and ENCs. With colleagues worked on new editions of List of Lights, Sailing Directions and created quality control forms and manuals for internal use.





### My career path and projects / Achievements

- 2015 2016 Latvian Hydrographic Service (LHS) took part in EU EMODnet Coastal Mapping project. LHS task together with other countries was to work on questionnaire and data analysis about bathymetric data governance in EU countries.
- 2015 our organization moved to new chart production software. As a part of transition we had training in new system.
- New duties included hydrographic survey data analyzing and creating output data for charts and notices to mariners.





### My career path and projects / Achievements

- 2017 LHS started to move chart production and data to new cartographic database and software system which is still ongoing project.
- My main duties are cartographic database updating, creating ENCs and updates, compilation of Notices on Mariners and new edition of List of Lights, chart production in Print on Demand system.
- 2019 Nautical Cartographer new name for cartographer position to better reflect our main responsibilities.

- Knowledge and experience I gained during Cartographic training in UKHO I'm using in my every day work.
- Visits to different UKHO production units and ports helped to have deeper understanding about chart production process and chart users needs.
