



What is the weather like?

The weather in Lisbon during September is still warm with average temperatures between 17°C (63°F) and 26°C (79°F). However you need to be prepared for the possibility of some light rain at this time of the year.

Will I be understood if I speak English?

Most people in Portugal can speak some English and in tourist destinations English is spoken fairly widely.

What electricity supply is used in Portugal?

Portugal uses 220/240 volts electricity supply. Most power points are of the the 2pin ungrounded power socket. Adapters can be purchased at the airport and local supermarkets but may be in short supply. US made adapters may require a transformer.



What Tax system is used?

Visitors to Portugal who are not resident in any of the European Union member states can be reimbursed for the VAT (Value Added Tax) paid on purchases that they have made in Portugal and are being transported in their personal luggage. Only private individuals can benefit from this reimbursement.

In order to obtain repayment of the tax, the minimum value of purchases must be € 49.88 (net amount without VAT), and, depending on the VAT rate charged, the minimum value of the receipt for goods purchased must be as follows:

- € 61.35 VAT rate of 23% (general goods)
- € 57.86 VAT rate of 16% (Madeira and the Azores)
- € 56.36 VAT rate of 13% (Wines)
- € 52.87 VAT rate of 6% (books, lenses...)

When you make your purchases, you must ask the shop to provide you with a receipt, itemising the amounts paid, the goods that were purchased and the amount that is due for reimbursement.

You can receive the repayment of your tax in cash at the main European airports or in the centres of major European cities, or by credit card or international cheque, provided that the goods in question have previously been shown and declared at the customs.

Do I have to tip?

This is not compulsory; however the standard practice is to tip hospitality industry staff (waiters, bar staff and hotel porters) and usually consists of a few coins. When dinner is well served, tip 1 to 2 euros. With regards to taxis, they already add a fee when they charge the taxi fare.

Can I drink the water?

Tap water in Lisbon is perfectly safe to drink. It may taste slightly different from the water you drink back home, this is merely due to its mineral content that you are not used to. Bottled water is available everywhere, from tiny kiosks to all supermarkets.
