Dear colleagues,

 As agreed at the last SCUFN meeting (Reference A), SCUFN-38 will be held as a face-to-face event in Denpasar-Bali, Indonesia, from Monday 10 to Friday 14 November 2025, thanks to the generous offer from the Indonesian Navy Hydro-Oceanographic Centre (Pushidrosal). In accordance with Reference C, all SCUFN Members are invited to be present. Proposers and Observers are more than welcome. 2. Following the usual practice that proved efficient (See Reference A), a provisional timetable for SCUFN-38 is provided as Annex A.

New IHO Portal

- 3. As announced by IHO circular letter (Reference D), the new IHO Portal has been commissioned since 6 January 2025. This collaborative platform provides additional features a simple website is not able to deliver, in line with today's digital practices. Consequently, all information related to SCUFN-38 (logistic, information, documents, registration) will only be made available through the IHO Portal.
- 4. All participants/delegates are reminded that an individual account will be necessary to access the IHO Portal and its <u>SCUFN section</u>.
- 5. Please monitor the SCUFN-38 IHO Portal Section periodically, as updates will be published as soon as they are received.

Registration – Logistic Information

- 6. All delegates intending to participate in SCUFN-38 are invited to register through the IHO Portal no later than 10 June 2025.
- 7. The Conference room capacity being limited, participants should register as early as possible. Priority for in-person participation will be for SCUFN Members. Other participants will be registered on a *first come*, *first registered basis*.
- 8. This letter constitutes a formal invitation to all SCUFN members, UFNPT, and observers/proposers to participate in SCUFN-38. In the meantime, delegates who need invitation letters to facilitate their visa requirements are kindly invited to contact the HSSC Secretariat (adcs@iho.int). It is highly recommended not to wait for the approval of your travel requests at the national level to request these invitation letters: letters can be provided in advance of travel approvals.
- 9. A logistic Information brief kindly prepared by the host country is annexed to this letter and made available on the SCUFN-38 meeting section on the IHO Portal (see 'information' Tab).
- 10. Participants/Delegates are requested to provide our host (Pushidrosal) with their travel and ID information **no later than 1st October 2025** (refer to Annex B for points of contact).

Agenda

- A draft of the provisional SCUFN-38 standard agenda and timetable will be available on the SCUFN-38 webpage in due time. SCUFN Members and Observers are invited to submit their suggestions to the SCUFN Chair/Secretariat, if any, no later than 10 June 2025.
- 12. Proposals to include new agenda items should reach the Secretariat as soon as possible and no later than 10 June 2025.

Proposals

- 13. In accordance with Reference C (ROP 2.8), please be reminded that "Proposals which are to be considered at SCUFN meetings must be submitted two months before meetings...". This applies in particular to naming proposals submitted by national naming boards, hydrographic offices, research institutes, etc. Deadline is therefore: 10 September 2025. In accordance with Reference C, it is also reminded that the number of proposals to be reviewed by SCUFN Members once a year is now capped to 250 proposals.
- 14. Other documents intended for consideration and decision making at the meeting, e.g., letters to the sub-committee, white papers or reports, change proposals for strategy or generic definitions, support paper of cookbook, undersea feature names Project Team report, maintenance of web services, interoperability, maintenance of the GEBCO Gazetteer, should reach the Secretary as early as possible, and **no later than 10 September 2025** as well. It is highly recommended to use the standard format (summary, background information, analysis, conclusion, recommendations, justification/impact, actions to be taken/considered by SCUFN) and/or to provide associated presentations in the same format.
- 15. Other documents, provided for information only, should be provided **no later than 10 October 2025**
- 16. For budget planning, official offers from SCUFN Members' supporting organization, IOC and IHO Member States, or Observers for hosting SCUFN-39 in 2026 (and SCUFN-40 in 2027 if possible) are welcome **no later than 10 September 2025** (See options already announced with Decision SCUFN37/12/02). Please provide the Secretariat with possible dates and venues at the same time.







TRANSPORTATION

I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS) to Bali Dynasty Resort, Bali Dynasty Resort is a short 3.3 km drive from DPS airport and will take between 10-20 minutes in a taxi. Many taxi companies will be available outside the arrivals terminal. We recommend you use a metered taxi company such as Bluebird (pictured below). The journey will cost approximately IDR 120,000 one way.

Transportation in Bali offers various options for visitors to get around the island. Public transportation is limited, but some options are available:

- a. Taxis are widely used, with both metered and fixed-price options; popular companies include Blue Bird, which is known for reliable service.
- b. Gojek, a popular ride-hailing application service, provides motorbike and car rides, making it a convenient and affordable way to travel short distances (The application available in app store and Play Store).

Unlike major cities, Bali does not have a train or subway system, so travelers must rely on road transport for commuting. For convenience, most visitors prefer taxis, Gojek, or private car rentals to explore the island.



CITY TOUR

Pushidrosal will provide and arrange a city tour for free on Thursday, 13th Nov 2025 for participants to the most stunning and attractive destination in Bali, such as: Tari Kecak Melasti Penglipuran Traditional Village, and Ubud (TBC).

OTHER INFORMATION

a. <u>Electricity/Socket type</u>

The standard voltage in Indonesia is 220 V / 50 Hz. Indonesia holds a standard socket of 2 round pins plug without a ground pin (Type A). Participants are recommended to bring their adaptors to comply with electric current and plugs.





b. <u>Currency</u>

The local currency is Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). USD 1 = \pm IDR 16,300 (as per March 10th, 2025).

c. Weather

In month November, the maximum temperature is 31°C and minimum temperature is 23°C (for an average temperature of 27°C). Bali's tropical climate creates an environment with temperatures that don't fluctuate much from one month to the next. The amount of rain increases as well as, the average rainfall for November is 70 mm, occurring over 13 days. The chance of seeing rain this month is relatively

high. The average humidity this month is 75%, which is on the uncomfortable side, especially paired with hot, rainy days.
