Dear meeting participants,

This document will be helpful to attend the SCUFN 35.1 in March. Please carefully read the following for your participation at venue or attending via online.

- Meeting period: 14 - 18 Mar 2022, respective meeting time are those announced by [SCUFN Letter 03/2021](#) (paragraph 4) and will be fine-tuned later.
- Meeting venue: UNESCO Headquarters, 7 place de Fontenoy, 75007 Paris France

- Meeting rooms: Room IX and Room III
- Express to attend the SCUFN 35.1:
  - SCUFN members who will be attending at the SCUFN 35, need to register on the IHO online registration system (face-to-face or VTC), then the SCUFN Secretary will ensure the liaison with the IOC Secretariat (Point of contact: Toshihiko CHIBA, [t.chiba@unesco.org](mailto:t.chiba@unesco.org) )
- Zoom preparation:
  - IOC has been reserved the Zoom meeting for 5 days during the SCUFN 35.1.
  - The link to be used will be made available on the SCUFN35 webpage.
  - If we cannot attain the meeting via Zoom, IOC may change it to MS-Teams instead.
- Notification for the meeting:
  - UNESCO has already set the meeting attention in the following. Please respect them when you will be at the SCUFN 35.1 in Mar. However, these are currently attention so that you will need to care about the amended notification if UNESCO will notify them.
    - ✓ face masks to be correctly worn, at all times on the UNESCO premises, except when speaking during the meeting,
    - ✓ In the meeting room, keep enough space between attendees are needed,
    - ✓ specific instructions and instruction signs will indicate possible restrictions on the use of elevators, distancing, one-way entrance or exit in meeting rooms, all staff are expected to respect these basic prevention rules,

- ✓ hydroalcoholic gel will be available at numerous locations on the premises, a hand wash is also efficient,
  - ✓ any attendee of the meeting developing symptoms (or suspected symptoms), whether vaccinated or not, must alert immediately, by mail or by phone, the Medical Service, until / unless they present a recent negative test result,
  - ✓ In the event of a confirmed covid case during the meeting, anyone in close contact with the contaminated person would need to isolate, until confirmation of a negative test result. The person is invited to contact the Medical Service, which will evaluate risks and give appropriate advice with regards to quarantine etc
- Regarding Vaccination information:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• À partir du 14 mars, l'application du « pass vaccinal » sera suspendue dans tous les endroits où il était exigé (lieux de loisirs et de culture, activités de restauration commerciales, foires et salons professionnels...).</li><li>• Après le 14 mars, Le « pass sanitaire » restera toutefois en vigueur dans les établissements de santé, les maisons de retraites, les établissements accueillant des personnes en situation de handicap.</li><li>• Depuis le 28 février, dans les lieux clos soumis au « pass vaccinal », le port du masque n'est plus obligatoire. Le port du masque en intérieur sera maintenu dans les transports et les lieux clos non soumis au « pass vaccinal ».</li><li>• Le « pass sanitaire » est devenu le « pass vaccinal » pour les personnes âgées de plus de 16 ans.</li><li>• Pour les personnes âgées de plus de 18 ans et 1 mois, la dose de rappel doit désormais être réalisée dès 3 mois après la fin de son schéma vaccinal initial et dans un délai de 4 mois maximum.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• From March 14, the application of the “vaccination pass” will be suspended in all places where it was required (leisure and cultural places, commercial catering activities, fairs and trade shows, etc.).</li><li>• After March 14, the “sanitary pass” will however remain in force in health establishments, retirement homes, establishments welcoming people with disabilities.</li><li>• Since February 28, in closed places subject to the “vaccination pass”, wearing a mask is no longer compulsory. Wearing a mask indoors will be maintained in transport and enclosed places not subject to the "vaccination pass".</li><li>• The “sanitary pass” has become the “vaccination pass” for people over 16 years old.</li><li>• For people aged over 18 years and 1 month, the booster dose must now be carried out as early as 3 months after the end of their initial vaccination schedule and within a maximum of 4 months.</li></ul>
