- The IENWG is composed of HOs of EU countries representatives from 8 RHCs (full members), other HOs of EU countries and the IHO secretariat
- France was elected as chair at the IENWG11 meeting (2-3 December 2020)

- IENWG12 (8-9 Dec 2021) by VTC with 11 European Member States








Meetings over the current chairmanship (2)

Meetings over the current chairmanship (3)

- IENWG13 (23 May 2023) held on the occasion of the annual **European Maritime Days** of the European Commission DG MARE in Brest, France
- Agenda of the meeting covered EU policies of interest for the IHO,
 projects and strategy
- Gathered 11 HOs and DG MARE (the Maritime innovation, Marine Knowledge and Investment Unit)
- IENWG and DG MARE discussed new opportunities for collaboration





IENWG13 review: what we are

- IENWG gives within the IHO an understanding of EU maritime policies and expectations and within the EU Commission the knowledge of the IHO and HOs competencies
- Values the dialog and interactions with the EU Commission and information sharing between the HOs
- Allows HOs to set up common position and to influence on EU maritime policies.
- Should continue to give priority to its capacity of networking, reactivity and informal way of working.

IENWG13 activities and strategy: way forward reported to the IRCC15

- Maritime policies (Work Track1): to continue to monitor and influence the EU policies
- Coastal mapping (WT2): to develop common acquisition campaigns of bathymetric data in the EU maritime basins
- **Development of the S-100 hydrographic products and services** (WT3): to promote across the European Commission (Blue economy, marine safety, protection of marine areas and biodiversity).
- Capacity Building (WT4): to promote the development of programs for the hydrographic capacity in the EU and outside EU (in connection with IRCC initiatives to extend CB funds)

The involvement of the IHO secretariat is an asset for the promotion activities at high level in the EU Commission

- EU Directive on open data and the re-use of public sector information HVD IENWG coordinate closely on the implementation instruction to exclude the data dissemination for free and without charges to products such as ENCs

- Common Information Sharing Environment for Maritime Security (hydrographic and cartographic data tests on S-124 navigational




A project which has become a long term marine data initiative 7 themes of Marine Data
