


## IMO Member State Audit of Denmark

The IMO Member State audit of Denmark was undertaken in November 2021. Since the scope of the audit included the flag, coastal and port state obligations of Denmark, the Danish Geodata Agency was among the audited agencies.

Prioritization of future charting of Greenland after 2026



### Charting in Greenland after 2026



Figures above: Summary of prioritized areas from the National Defence (left) and Civil users (right) in relation to future needs for coastal charts.

- User survey with both civilian and military users: Conformity between the results from two user surveys regarding the prioritization of future charting in Greenland
- The highest prioritized areas are:
  - Southwest and South Greenland
  - Around Thule Airbase
  - Central part of East Greenland (around Tasiilaq, Mestersvig and Illoqqortoormiut (Scoresbysund).

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
