



### **TOP ACHIEVEMENTS SINCE EATHC16 (3 MAXIMUM)**

- Regional charting activity:
  - Paper Charts: 13 New Editions
  - 1 New ENC: Port of Lekki (GB4DKJAB)
  - Maintained and updated regional charts and publications
  - New and updated MOUs with regional partners







#### **TOP ACHIEVEMENTS SINCE EATHC16 (3 MAXIMUM) CONTINUED**

International Hydrographic Organization

UK became EAtHC Associate Members

- Resumption of IHO-Nippon Foundation Category B Cartography training course
  - Delivered the twice postponed 2020 course between January – May 2022
  - August December 2022 GeoMAC course includes students from Ghana and Nigeria
  - Course reaccredited for five years
  - Continued online training courses
  - Recruited more trainers







#### TOP ISSUES OR SHORTFALLS (3 MAXIMUM)

International Hydrographic Organization

 Early unplanned closure of in-house chart printing operation

- Maintaining regional contacts
- Timely provision of quality local data: We don't know what we don't know







#### TOP PLANS THAT AFFECT THE REGION (3 MAXIMUM)

(CHARTS, SURVEYS, TRAINING, CAPACITY BUILDING, OTHER)

- Intention to transition to Digital Only chart production by end of 2026
  - From 2027, UKHO no longer intends to produce any paper charts, raster charts or issue paper chart NMs
  - Within the UK, we are working with our regulator to identify suitable solutions for all users and will work with PCA partners on this going forward









## TOP PLANS THAT AFFECT THE REGION (3 MAXIMUM) (CHARTS, SURVEYS, TRAINING, CAPACITY BUILDING, OTHER)

- Implement new "gridded" GB ENC schema
- In-region Capacity Building and collaboration:
  - Support IHO Technical Assessment Visit to Sierra Leone
  - Provide survey support for The Gambia Ports Authority
  - Establish new and update existing MOUs







#### TOP CHALLENGES FOR THE NEXT 2-3 YEARS (3 MAXIMUM)

International Hydrographic Organization  Ensure availability of S-101 ENCs to support IHO timelines and mandation

- Recruitment of technical resource:
  - Trained surveyors to support data collection and processing
  - Personnel to support Technical Training requests
- Establish strategy for contributing data to Seabed 2030:
  - MOU signed with GEBCO Seabed 2030
  - Started sharing data at gridded 100m resolution
  - Investing in machine-based, data processing
