
The SL's Maritime Domain

Total Area 71,740 Km² Land area 71,620 Km² Water Area – 120 Km² Coastline – 406 Km




A Section of SL's 406 Km coastline – Lumley Beach

The Core Mandates of the SLMA

- To ensure the safety of navigation; protect the marine environment and promote sustainable exploitation of SL's Blue Economy
- To regulate shipping activities and seafarers' matters by fulfilling Sierra Leone's Flag, Port and Coastal State Responsibilities
- To propose policies for the development and maintenance of maritime infrastructure
- To enhance maritime security

Recent Development and Current Activities SLMA/UKHO

• Feb – 2023: a joint field technical mission to SL by the UKHO. Reps included, Mr. Nathanael KNAPP (Head of Delegation), Ms. Cathy TUNKS and Mr. David PARKER

- Nov 2023: SL updated its submission of the IHO's Yearbook (P-5)
- Dec 2023: Signing of Arrangement for Cooperation between UKHO and SLMA. (SLMA fulfilling SOLAS safety of navigation obligations)
- Planned UKHO in-country Hydrographic Governance Training and establishment of a National Hydrographic Action Plan July 2024

Recent Development and Current Activities SLMA/IALA

- February 2023 a joint field technical mission to SL by IALA WWA. Reps included Mrs. Geradine DELANOYE IALA's Head of Mission
- April 2023 Country Report submitted by IALA with recommendations
- SLMA to benefit from capacity building opportunities 2 staff already trained and certified in AtoN Management
- Financial Resources ringfenced for procurement of AtoN


Eastern Atlantic Hydrographic Commission (EAtHC) – The way forward

• SLMA to follow up on EAtHC West Africa Action Team's 2002 and 2018 engagements

Intentions of the GoSL

- To strengthen the strategic alliances with development partners to improve safety of navigation in SL waters
- SLMA to regularize its status with IALA, IHO, and other NGOs;
- · SLMA to establish a fully equipped National Hydrographic Office; and
- SLMA's implementation of the UKHO and IALA Recommendations resulting from the Technical Assessment Visit (TAV) of Feb. 2023 detailed Corrective Action Plan (CAP) with concrete timelines.
