- · Renovation of the Northern Heritage Quay infrastructure












Top achievements during the year

Top challenges and/or obstructions

- Lack of synergy and effective cooperation and coordination among stakeholders in developing maritime infrastructures.
- Lack of a dedicated hydrographic survey platform to optimize the utilization of the Portable Multi-Beam Equipment obtained from the UKHO under the CMEP Programme.
- Establishing a National Regime for the delivery of Hydrographic Services
