Introduction and purpose

- The SAIHC MSDIWG convened an online meeting on 7th September 2020 to brief on the annual report ahead of the deferred SAIHC 17. A key discussion during this session was the need to have a focussed session on Crowd Sourced Bathymetry (CSB) and Seabed 2030; this was held on 2nd February 2021. The key aims of the meeting were to enable SAIHC to be better briefed on the initiative and to formally identify a regional coordinator.
- 2. This document provides a synopsis of the meeting, including Records of Decisions (RODs).

Opening remarks by SAIHC Chair

3. The SAIHC Chair opened the meeting and described the long history that IHO has to encourage innovative ways to gather data so that we can better understand the bathymetry of the seas, oceans and coastal waters and complete the picture of our seafloor. Reference was made to citizen science through crowdsourced bathymetry (CSB), and how this can contribute to mapping the ocean.

The Nippon Foundation-GEBCO Seabed 2030 Project, the UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development, the UN Sustainable Development Goals, in particular SDG14, and other global programmes have both supported and highlighted the importance of this initiative. The SAIHC Chair welcomed Dr Vicki Ferrini, Head of the Atlantic / Indian Ocean Regional Data Centre and Commander Christoff Theunissen from the South African Navy to provide insightful updates on this subject.

Overview of Atlantic and Indian Ocean Regional Data Centre Presentation by Dr Vicki Ferrini

4. This presentation highlighted what is Seabed 2030 and focused on the regional data coverage available so far which really stressed the significant work still to be done to achieve the ambitious goals of the project. The session invoked good debate and questions around the need for coverage, prioritisation, meta data requirements and challenges to access data depending on respective National policies.

SAIHC CSB/Seabed2030 Presentation by Cdr Christoff Theunissen

- 5. The MSDI WG Chair (UK) confirmed that South Africa has volunteered to assume the role of SAIHC CSB/Seabed 2030 Coordinator. The lead point of contact will be Cdr Christoff Theunissen.
- 6. SANHO National Hydrographer, Capt. Theo Stokes, opened the session and outlined South Africa's work in this field and introduced Cdr Christoff Theunissen to present on the trial CSB initiative. In closing SANHO noted the following:
 - a. Invite Member States to take note of IRCC 12 Action Items.
 - b. Invite Member States to make use of the opportunity to deploy the additional 50 data loggers made available by NOAA through the RSA.
 - c. Invite participating Member States to share CSB initiatives with RSA as SAIHC CSB Coordinator.
