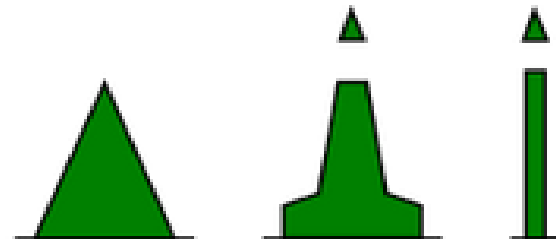


Harmonization of Aids to Navigation Signals

Education and Training



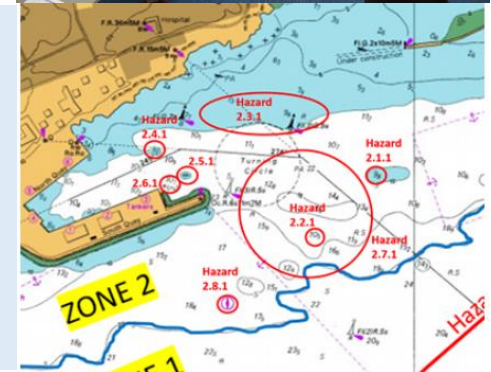
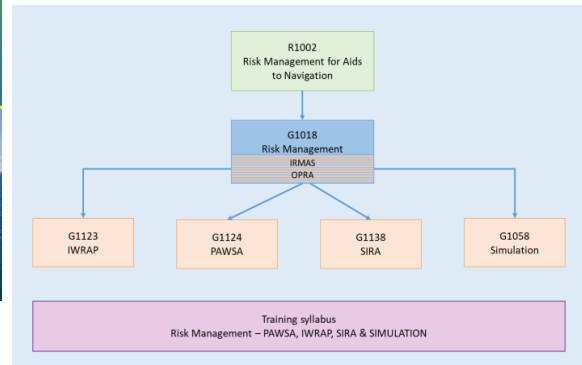
- Supports the development of IALA Model Courses in close cooperation with the IALA technical committees;
