<b>Review and agreement of minutes and actions arising</b>	<p>HP opened the meeting.</p> <p>Minutes from the 15<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SWPHC MSDI WG accepted as true and correct.</p> <p>HP welcomed new members Ueakeia Tofinga and Matthew Ellis.</p>
<b>Feedback from presentations to SWPHC21 and IHO MSDI WG</b>	<p>HP gave feedback on presentations and reports submitted to SWPHC21 in Fiji and IHO MSDI WG15 in Indonesia.</p> <p>Reports were well received by the wider SWPHC and MSDI WG participants and have been shared on the relevant IHO web pages for both groups. There was lots of interest in the activities of the SWPHC MSDI WG over the past year.</p> <p>SWPHC Report here - <a href="#">SWPHC21 - MSDI WG Report</a></p> <p>IHO MSDI WG Report here - <a href="#">MSDIWG15 - SWPHC MSDI WG Report</a></p>

	<p>SWPHC21 Feedback</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- SWPHC in Fiji – Meeting of the SWPHC MSDI WG allowed some members to attend who may not always be able to join online. Also encouraged new members to join the working group more permanently.</li> <li>- Suggestions from wider SWPHC community on actions that the working group could take forward in the workplan for the coming year.</li> </ul> <p>HP invited discussion from WG members</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- AM – Does the working group intend to have a roadmap for the coming year and what deliverables do we want to achieve as a working group?</li> <li>- HP provided more information on the SWPHC workplan which defines the actions for the working group. First major items on the workplan resulted in the production of the data sharing document and the IGIF implementation guidance.</li> <li>- SWPHC is now working on an updated workplan, including the theory of change diagram. Some actions from this workplan may define the plan for the working group. The working group can also put forward suggestions for the workplan which can be raised with the SWPHC coordination committee.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Review and discussion of SWPHC Theory of Change and effect on the SWPHC MSDI WG Workplan</b></p>	<p>SWPHC have developed a new approach to defining the workplan for the commission using the “Theory of Change” model. HP shared the SWPHC Theory of Change diagram with the working group – <a href="#">SWPHC21 Theory of Change WP-SWPHC IHO Goals Bow-tie.pdf</a></p> <p>HP highlighted some items of the diagram which affect MSDI and may affect the activities of the working group, items listed on the Theory of Change diagram that received comments from the working group are as follows:</p> <p><b>IHO Target to Build a Portal to support and promote regional and international cooperation in marine spatial data infrastructure</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- HP highlighted that this target has been challenged at IHO and may not be something that the working group can influence.</li> <li>- BJ suggested a similar activity has been worked on in the MACHC region and could ask someone from that project team to present to us if this would be useful. In the MACHC region a common portal was considered beneficial to members, but would this translate to the SWPHC region?</li> <li>- AM raised that combined portals have been of interest to the NZ MGI Working Group in New Zealand. Prototype has been developed to bring together many organisations data holdings. Would be interesting to hear of any case studies from other countries or organisations.</li> <li>- DA has also been adopting a similar MSDI structure for Australia providing open access to publicly accessible source data. Was the concern around the IHO data portal regarding the ‘aggregating’ of other portals or ‘hosting’ the data portal via the IHO. HP expanded that main concerns were around hosting a central database by IHO, data permissions, and other considerations needed to be investigating and thought through properly. How could the working group help contribute to this goal?</li> <li>- NE provided insight from AusSeabed and agreed with comments that hosting a central portal is too complicated and problematic, but an aggregated portal to show other data holdings provided by organisations would be a useful tool for discoverability of data. AusSeabed Portal hosts a small amount of their own data, but also displays data from other organisations as an aggregation tool. Creating an</li> </ul>

underlying portal may not be difficult, but it may be tricky to encourage people to participate in the aggregated portal that is created.

- AM asked NE if there was any guidance on cost of implementation of an aggregated portal.
- NE commented that the AusSeabed portal is built on open software and standards so the cost of implementation isn't too high but do not have to pay for ongoing licensing. There is some cost to hosting the infrastructure and ongoing IT support required to keep it operational.
- HP will feedback comments to the SPWHC workplan committee.

**Agree a value proposition which promotes value of hydrography:**

- HP commented that the working group has completed some work on this previously, is there any value in doing more work on this target?
- BJ asked whether it would be worth writing an article for a publication in International Hydrographic Review or other publication?
- General consensus to work on promoting the document in other fora as it will keep the work discoverable for longer.

**IGIF Implementation Activity**

- Is this something that would benefit the region? Is it worth the working group focussing more on this task?
- AM – Could be valuable and would like to raise idea with NZ MGI Working Group, what kind of work could be done to support this activity?
- HP – Videos produced should be really useful, but is there anything else the working group could do and does it add value for the commission members to complete these maturity assessments and implement IGIF-H.
- HP & BJ – Shared concerns about whether maturity assessment is beneficial for the region? It is a useful tool for some organisations, but may not be useful for everyone? Would it be useful to develop a questionnaire to ask wider community whether WG activities are useful so far, what else could we work on. To ask for feedback we need to explain what we are doing in an easily understandable written method.
- AM – Were there any use cases of organisations that have completed similar activities, what were the benefits, what were the challenges, was the overall outcome valuable?
- BJ – Would be interesting to ask what this working group could do to support organisations, is there any benefit to this task being centralised by the working group? What can we do to support and not hinder the task for organisations?

**HP invited other comments from members, are there any other activities that this working group could work on to contribute to the SWPHC workplan?**

- BJ raised that there is a similar working group in the region led by Vaipo Mataora and some tasks and activities may overlap. It would be beneficial to identify where our activities overlap. Engage with the Pacific Geospatial and Surveying Council to find out where we overlap and how we might be able to work together.
- HP had comments from the Pacific Geospatial and Surveying Council and with Andrick Lal from SPC to engage with them on how we can collaborate with others in the region.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Goal to share resources, reduce duplication of effort and collaborate on tasks of mutual interest.</li> <li>- CJ provided comments outside of the working group meeting that it would be beneficial for the working group to consider workplan activities that related to partnerships and engaging with regional partners. MSDI principles include standardising data for non-traditional uses which is something that the working group could usefully support.</li> </ul> <p>HP concluded discussion with information that the SWPHC Workplan meeting will be held in the next few weeks and feedback on the workplan meeting would be provided to members. Encouraged working group members to think about how we promote the work of the working group and encourage feedback from wider community.</p>
<b>Nominations and election of vice chair</b>	<p>HP confirmed that members could put themselves forward for Vice Chair and did not have to be part of an IHO member state organisation. BP has expressed an interest in becoming Vice Chair at previous meetings, this has been confirmed as within IHO WG guidelines and the SWPHC if BP is still interested in the role. With that in mind HP invited working group members to volunteer for the vice chair role or put forward nominations for vice chair.</p> <p>AM nominated Belen if they are still willing to be vice chair. This nomination was accepted by Belen Jimenez Baron and seconded by NE.</p> <p>Belen Jimenez Baron agreed to take on the role of Vice Chair of the SWPHC MSDI working group.</p>
