Hydrography focuses on:

- measuring and describing the physical features of oceans, seas, coastal areas, lakes and rivers as well as in the prediction of their change over time.

Hydrography involves

- The collection of hydrographic data
- The production of nautical charts and publications
- The collection and dissemination of Maritime Safety Information (MSI)



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Inadequate hydrography implies:

- Risk of marine accidents increases
 - environmental pollution
 - -loss of lives
- Shipping lacks confidence in ports and routes
- International trade is limited and more expensive
- Missed economic opportunities
- Inability to properly delimit, declare and enforce national maritime boundaries
- Environmental impacts
- Potential liability and litigation








SOLAS – Obligations on Governments

SOLAS Chapter V, Regulation 9 and Regulation 4

In resume <u>each State</u> must ensure that:

- Hydrographic surveys are carried out
- Appropriate nautical charts and other nautical publications are <u>available</u> and <u>up to date</u>
- Maritime Safety Information (MSI) is received and promptly brought to the knowledge of those concerned





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


Resolution A.53/32 of the General Assembly– Oceans and the law of the sea

Point 21..... invites States to <u>cooperate</u> in carrying out <u>hydrographic</u> <u>surveys</u> and in providing <u>nautical services</u> for the purpose of ensuring safe navigation as well as to ensure the greatest uniformity in charts and nautical publications and to coordinate their activities so that hydrography and nautical information is available on a world-wide scale







- Participate in all aspects of the Organization Committees and working groups.






