





• Marine Division of the Ministry of Information, Communication and Transport is the entity responsible for ensuring maritime safety in Kiribati.








Main achievements during the last year

- 1 island in Phoenix Group (Kanton) NOAA
- Betio Port, Tarawa UKHO

Recruitment - 3 (2F, 1M) new staff – undergoing Cat B training (funded by KOTIIP and AHO)






Main achievements during the last year



Development of a MSDI

- Utilise the Kiribati Marine Spatial Planning Coordinating Committee (KMSPCC) with MFMRD as Secretariat to coordinate MSDI Development
 - Hydrographic and Geospatial Data Management Committees as sub-committees
 - Building on previous knowledge of IGIF to develop plan of actions/work plan
 - Data management, policies, access, etc.
 - Looking for advice from SPC and industry partners in developing physical infrastructure
 - 1 workshop with IUCN BIOSCAPE (through MFMRD) Marine Spatial Planning
