





Policy and Frameworks **Governance and Oversight** 1. Develop a One-Maritime Framework 2024-2030, with appropriate plans and solutions that are adaptable to varying circumstances across the region, and incorporate monitoring, evaluation and learning. 2. Provide technical support to improve aviation safety and security systems, and compliance with the International Civil Aviation Organisation's requirements. 3. Developing an enhanced connectivity strategy for the Pacific **Capacities and Capabilities** 4. Increase research, adoption and implementation of green and low carbon transport options and technology, noting the varying circumstances across

- the Pacific. 5. Enhancing supply chain resilience and strengthening

Financing

- 6. Increase support for regionally accredited entities to access the Green Climate Fund, to implement climate resilient infrastructure projects. 7. Increase support for the Pacific Regional
- Infrastructure Facility (PRIF) to facilitate infrastructure financing coordination amongst stakeholder including identifying opportunities for private sector participation.

1. Strengthen the various existing regional structures that coordinate and cooperate on the development of ICT in the Pacific ensuring cyber security to be prioritised at the ICT Ministerial Meeting.

Capacities and Capabilities

Regional Collective Actions

- 2. Strengthen regional cyber security and safety approaches that are culturally sensitive and harness the potential of technology to respond to key opportunities and challenges.
- Strengthen regional capacity building mechanisms for computer emergency response teams (CERT) and identify approaches to support effective coordination, cooperation and policy development to maximise opportunities and minimise risks posed by evolving technology.
- Strengthen regional approaches to enhance the capacity of Pacific broadcasting networks
- Bridging the gender digital divide by promoting access to ICT and digital services for all pacific peoples particularly women and girls in all their diversity while ensuring online safety and minimising harmful impacts.


PACIFIC ONE-MARITIME FRAMEWORK (POMF)



- The development of a Pacific One-Maritime Framework (POMF) intends to create a single framework that articulates strategies to cater for sustainable maritime sector needs, priorities, and ambitions of PICTs in the context of the Blue Pacific and aligned with the technical support of regional and international maritime sector entities and development partners.
- Provides a platform for PICTs to reflect on their current challenges and articulate their aspirations for safe, secure and sustainable maritime transport services comprehensively, informed by their circumstances, yet framed in the context of region-wide responses.
- Expectation: the national and regional plans will be aligned to the mandates and plans of regional and international development partners ensuring that required technical and financial resources will be targeted to assist PICTs in implementing their maritime development objectives;
- Framework focus: needs, priorities, challenges and emerging issues in the maritime sector in the Blue Pacific; with clear actions and targets focusing on mobilising appropriate resources, finances, infrastructure, technology and capacity building for a safe, resilient, green, clean, digital, gender-just maritime transport for the Blue Pacific.

Suva, Fiji – The Pacific Community (SPC) and the European Union (EU) have today signed a funding agreement which will contribute to the development of a Pacific Regional One Maritime Framework.

The Framework is a response to the request from the Pacific Transport Ministers during the 2023 Pacific Energy and Transport Ministerial Meeting held in Port Vila, Vanuatu. It aims to address and respond to the needs, priorities, challenges and emerging issues in the maritime sector in the Pacific focussing on safety and security, decarbonisation efforts, cost and access for remote communities.

The Pacific Regional One Maritime Framework (POMF) aims to address and respond to needs, priorities, challenges and emerging issues in the maritime sector in the Pacific focusing on safety and security, decarbonisation efforts, cost and access for remote communities. The POMF is an outcome from the 2023 Pacific Transport Ministers Meeting, where ministers had called for a cohesie and innovative and innovative framework.

RELATED COUNTRIES

SPC will be co-implementing this work with partners in the Pacific region including international Maritime Organisation (IMO), SPREP, PRIF and other CROP agencies. This work will be implemented in a partnership-based manner with consultations regionally and nationally.

KEY OBJECTIVES

Establishment and implementation of a Pacific Regional One Maritime Framework (POMF) aims to transform the maritime transport sector in the Blue Pacific into one that is safe, clean, resilient and sustainable, while promoting digital innovation and gender equity.

Establishment and Implementation of a Pacific Rogioni. One Haritime Framework (POHS) alms to transform the multime transport sector in the Base Pacific into one that is safe, clean, resilient an sustainable, while promoting digital innovation and gender equily.

- Recommending that the POMF be included in the SWPHC work plan;


