

Navigational Warnings (NAVWARNs) replace Notices to Shipping (NOTSHIPs) and shall be construed as Notices to Shipping






## IHO ATLANTIC COAST TRANSBOUNDARY MEETING

  - 4. Time to discuss transboundary product solutions


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#### **IHO** PACIFIC COAST TRANSBOUNDARY REQUEST

- CHS Pacific region wishes to amend the existing transboundary agreement to use the 48° parallel instead of the 47°59'00" at the Band 2 usage band level.
- Thus, the following small scale ENCs need to be adjusted in order to meet at the 48° parallel:
- US2WC03M
- US2WC12M
- CA270389
- CA270388?



Note: Since the Agreement US2WC12M has been split into US2WC03M and US2WC12M



## IHO TRANSBOUNDARY NEXT STEPS

- Share notes of all meetings on **Google Drive** so all CHS and NOAA offices have access
- Schedule a transboundary meeting to discuss Alaska/British Columbia border as Canada is currently creating gridded ENCs
- Draft a **list of criteria** to determine if CATCOV 1/CATCOV 2 cut along border or single-agency charting should be used. This will help provide guidance.
- There will be a challenge with creating **automated paper charts** if we cut along border. HGPSC to investigate solutions.
  - Joint shared folder to push/pull current transboundary cells?
- Continue to use **transboundary web map** for discussions. Consider ways to add linked documents to capture decisions.
