PRINCE ALBERT 1ST MEDAL FOR HYDROGRAPHY

IHO has an existing means to recognise significant contributions to the work of IHO the Prince Albert 1st Medal for Hydrography*.

The medal is awarded on a triennial basis which limits how many contributors can be recognised in this way.

This mechanism does not support recognition of broader contributors from Industry or the IHO Secretariat (past and present).

The current situation does not allow for appropriate formal recognition of contributions to the IHO.

It is necessary to consider this holistically across all IHO organs and subordinate groups hence, the HSSC should propose this to the Council.

The proposed new award would be more inclusive and contribute to the motivation of active contributions within the IHO.

The HSSC chair group in liaison with the IRCC chair group should develop a proposal for submission to Council 7 to establish a new award to recognise significant contributions to hydrography by individuals to be awarded by the Council.
