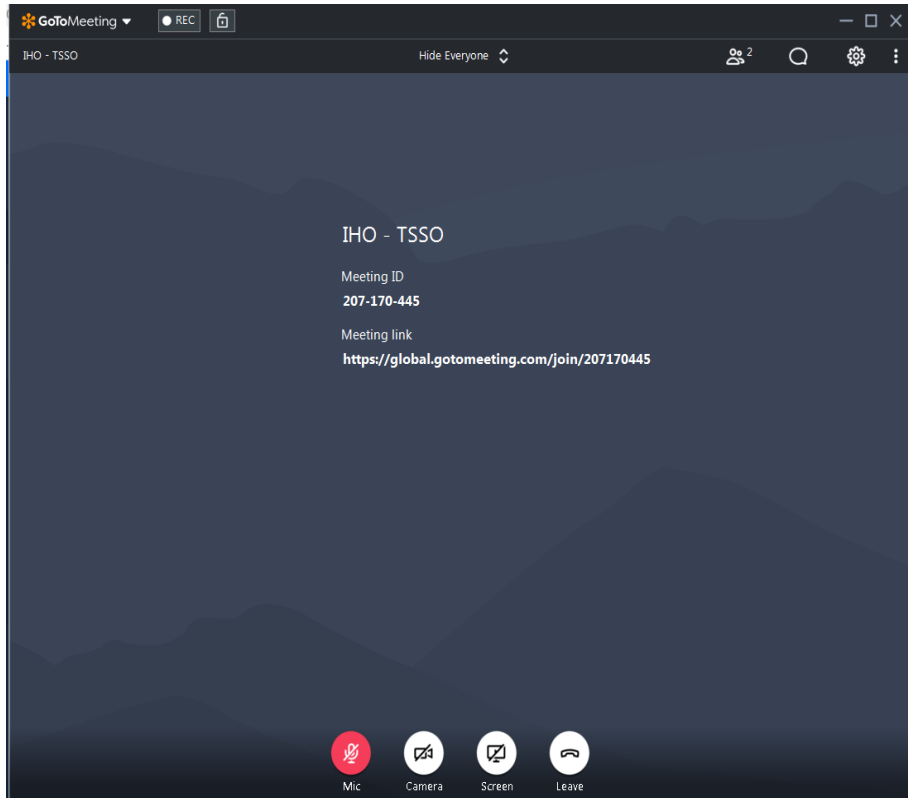

- In November 2020 HSSC 12 item [05.2C](#) led to HSSC decision 12/26 which states;

HSSC agreed that all references to the so-called technical “master/slave” relationship should not be used in future IHO publications and standards.

- I am pleased to confirm that although some instances remain in S-101 1.0.0 where diagrams and tables had not reflected the text, such terms have been expunged (removed) from the current S-101 working documents, if any S-101PT member identifies any further terms that could be deemed offensive please raise them with me
- [Assembly 2 decision 7](#) approved the establishment of an IHO strategy and resolution for gender-inclusive language, IHO Sec Gen was tasked to reflect this in IHO documentation and monitor progress towards implementation of relevant UN guidelines.
- I therefore encourage S-101PT members to adopt the strategies set out in the UN guidelines linked below;
